Joseph Frederick Laycock



Pilot Officer Royal Canadian Air Force

Killed during Harvard training flight Sept. 12, 1941 Age 25



Fred Laycock was born and raised one mile west of Okotoks. He joined the air force in 1940 and trained at Brandon, North Battleford, Edmonton and Moose Jaw. While training to be an instructor, Fred was killed Sept. 12, 1941 in a crash of a Harvard training plane 10 miles southeast of Tweed Hastings County, Ontario. He was 25. Fred is buried at Calgary
