

Executive Summary

From December 9 – January 31 the Okotoks community was invited to provide input on the Okotoks wayfinding project through an online survey. Creating an effective wayfinding system has been identified as a priority for several years. It is an important tool for inspiring and guiding people to discover areas of Okotoks away from the main routes and increase customer traffic. This has been identified as a key strategy to help local businesses recover as quickly as possible after the pandemic.

The survey included three concepts for participants to consider, including three potential gateway illustrations for the downtown. The concepts were intended to illustrate the types of forms, structures, materials and colours that could be incorporated into a finished design.

A total of 482 people participated in this phase of the wayfinding public participation. The results suggested that the purpose of the wayfinding program was not clearly expressed, and some respondents questioned whether this was the appropriate time to develop one for Okotoks.

Key Results:

Through the comments and responses to the survey questions, the following key results were identified:

- Overall the comments suggested that none of the currently proposed concepts is perceived to be fully representative of Okotoks' character.
- For the wayfinding concepts, Concept B was the design that the majority of respondents thought would improve the feeling of the town, and Concept C received the highest number of positive comments.
- The materials and design for Concept C received the most positive feedback and could inform future design exploration.
- Many comments referenced a desire to have a design that reflects the "Old Town Okotoks" style, which is less modern, with a small town, rural aesthetic. This suggests taking a design approach that's more reflective of the history and architecture of the heritage downtown area. Further exploration of how the character of Okotoks overall is perceived by the community, for relevance and longevity of the wayfinding system, would be beneficial.
- Some of the comments also suggested that a more refined colour palette, which better reflects the heritage nature of the town, would better represent the community's character. This could include a more neutral or heritage colour palette with pops of bright



colour to add appeal.

Concept A

- Responses indicated that this concept had the least support for representing Okotoks.
 Respondents were split on their opinions about whether these concepts were clear and
 noticeable, distracting or could be missed. The colour palette was also not popular in this
 concept.
- Sign legibility was also divided, although most people indicated a degree of consistency with this concept.
- The sign's structure received the highest approval with the lettering style being well received.
- Consistency and lettering style were the most positive items for this concept. The results indicated that respondents were divided on the structure.
- Gateway signs stand out well during the day, but would require better illumination at night. The lettering style was well received, while the structure of this design was not well received.

Concept B

- Most responses indicated that this concept would improve the feeling of the town, and although a majority also felt this concept was distracting, the response suggests the design would capture the attention of passersby. Sign legibility was divided, with many indicating that the design consistency across sign types included in the concept was disjointed.
- The lettering style, structure of design and colours were well received, while the structure of the gateway design was not popular.
- Gateway signs were perceived to stand out well during the day, and illumination was largely perceived to be obvious. Colours and lettering style were the most positive items for this concept. The structure and disjointed/distracting nature of the gateway signs were items that could be improved upon.



Concept C

- The majority of responses on the survey indicated this concept wasn't suitable for Okotoks, although the majority of comments were positive.
- Sign legibility and consistency were almost evenly split, with a slight majority indicating that it was noticeable or very clear.
- The majority liked the materials while the colours were least popular.
- Feedback on the gateway signs indicated that this concept had some elements that were working well.
- Gateway signs are perceived to stand out well during the day, and the illumination at night seems appropriate.
- Materials were the most positive item for this concept, while the approach to colour was negative.

Conclusions


It is important that wayfinding systems are reflective of the character of the community, therefore the designs should represent the values that the residents and businesses feel best represent Okotoks now and well into the future. Using the values-based responses from previous public participation activities (e.g. Downtown Urban Design Master Plan; Okotoks Community Vision; Household Survey; Okotoks Culture, Heritage & Arts Master Plan, etc.) combined with the responses to wayfinding questions in the Downtown Vitalization Plan survey and the results from this survey, has helped to begin to identify elements to incorporate into the wayfinding designs.

Key findings include:


- Materials: A mix of natural elements such as stone, rock and wood is largely preferred (Concept C)
- Colour palette: Some would prefer to see incorporation of more heritage colours (greens, browns, neutral)
- Structure: A large number of comments suggest a desire to incorporate more heritage elements into the design that celebrate the small town atmosphere and river valley landscape (Concept C)
- Lettering style Clean, modern, easy to read (Concept A)




What Best describes your Role?









How well do you think the sign will show up on the street or pathway?




Sign Legibility

How legible do you think the information on the sign will be?








Preferred sign elements





Least liked elements of the sign family





Is there one member of the sign family thta you enjoy the LEAST?













Preferred sign elements






Least Preferred Sign Family

Is there one member of the sign family that you enjoy the LEAST?












Preferred Sign

Least Preferred Sign





Gateway AHow well do you think this gateway treatment will stand out during the day?








Gateway AHow well do you think this gateway treatment will stand out during the night?





Gateway BHow well do you think this gateway treatment will stand out during the day?




How well do you think this gateway treatment will stand out during the night?



Comment Summary

The following tags were used to group the comments under themes:

There were a total of 207 comments; there was often more than one theme expressed in each comment. For example, many who disliked all the designs, also indicated they didn't fit the character but supported the project. Others who disliked all designs did indicate a preference for one of the designs. Because of this, some comments will be duplicated in the totals.

There were 21 comments that were not relevant to the survey and have not been included in the summary.

Dislike all	76	These designs are seriously awful. Tacky, uninspiring, don't fit the design or feel of downtown at all. They are unnecessary. Something simple, locally created, old town feeling would be way better. These look like cheap garbage.
		These aren't good options. Please make them less modern to fit with the old towns okotoks style. They're too big and look too City, instead of the quaintness okotoks offers. A small discrete sign is fine.
		My immediate impression of #1 was Canmore, #2 was Busy & Juvenile. I agrees with Lisa that it feels these 2 were designed to make #3 stand out as the "winner", however it still feels generic. The height of the signage was also bothering me, and Lisa hit that on the head - it is not reflective of the majority of the structures in the RD. I would also like more information on where signage will be placed. It is essential the entire River District is included - areas west of Southridge & east of Lineham (poor choice as this excludes a large portion of RD) or 32st.



Did not support character of the downtown/ community (note that many also indicated that they disliked all designs)	75	Please keep in mind that Okotoks is a rural town and not "big city" The designs should match the feel of the town, the ambiance and character of our older buildings on Elizabeth. These designs are tacky and colours are too bright. Might as well buy the blue circle from Calgary too if you go this route.
		These are pretty bland. They could be a lot more creative and interesting. There's tons of artists and designers in town that could do a much better job than these. They're okay, but they're basic.
		Seems the first two concepts were created in hopes that the last concept would be chosen. It worked. The first two gateway signs were over blown for the size and feel of the River District, and would create a feeling of "misinformation" on what is to come on the rest of the drive East. The River District has primarily single level, "character" buildings and the design for wayfinding should reflect that character, not something "grandiose." The first concept overall comes across like a mountain town like Banff or Canmore and doesn't reflect Okotoks offerings at all nor it's current design. The second concept focuses too much on the river and feels cartoony (gateway) and generic (other signs). The last is simple and the design feels natural.
