# PROPOSED ENTERTAINMENT DISTRICT PILOT

## **BACKGROUND**

In December 2021, the Alberta Government passed The Red Tape Reduction Implementation Act (formerly bill 80), which amended the Gaming, Liquor and Cannabis Act to allow for the creation of Entertainment Districts.


Entertainment Districts are specified public areas where adults may consume alcohol outside of a licensed premises while enjoying a variety of entertainment options. Bars and restaurants, within a designated district area, will be eligible to serve liquor for consumption within the boundary.

#### WHY AN ENTERTAINMENT DISTRICT?

We recognize that in many municipalities, Okotoks included, the downtown area is often the heart of the community. Okotoks Town Council has identified a "Strong Local Economy" as part of their 2022-2025 Strategic Plan. An Entertainment District pilot could help create and support activities in our downtown. The pilot is designed to determine whether such a district would benefit our downtown community, small and local businesses, as well as promote tourism

The Town heard from the Okotoks & District Chamber of Commerce that several Okotoks businesses were keen on a pilot such as this. The Chamber did approach Town Council asking them to consider implementing an Entertainment District for the 2022 event season. At that time, Council indicated they would consider it in 2023, once there was an opportunity to hear from community and business owners, like you.






Q1: What is your level of support for an Entertainment District in downtown Okotoks?

During special events only, weekends only, shorter window during the day, length of pilot, etc.



### Boundary & Location (7 Comments)

Size of district, area/streets included, type of businesses in the boundary, lack of accessibility.

## May 15: Entertainment District goes to GPC for committee discussion.

Discussion will resume at the Governance and Priorities Committee (GPC) on Monday, May 15 beginning at 4:30 p.m. GPC meetings are open to the public to attend in-person or to watch the livestream if you would like to hear the discussion. The GPC is an opportunity for Council to have a deeper conversation and fully discuss potential policy, bylaws and community feedback from public participation before they come forward to a regular Council meeting where bylaws are read.



## May 23: After GPC discussions, the Bylaw goes to Council for consideration.

The proposed pilot goes before Council for consideration of next steps dependent upon at the discussion of the GPC on May 15.
