Okotoks residents live in one of the most scarce water regions in Canada. As such, we have a shared responsibility to live within the means of the Sheep River. The four outdoor watering stages follow responsible water use practices and become increasingly cautious, depending on the current river and reservoir levels. This helps to maintain sufficient water supply for indoor household use, commercial use and fire suppression during dry summer months.

Land Use Bylaw Amendment

Council approves permanent deer deterrent fencing

Following a public hearing on June 12, Town Council approved a Land Use Bylaw (LUB) amendment to include permanent deer deterrent fencing as part of ongoing deer mitigation strategies. The amendment enables the heights of backyard fences to increase to 2.3 meters (approx. 7.5 feet) provided they are chain-link, wrought iron or rail style when adjacent to open space. This height is expected to deter deer and also provides visibility, light and air flow.
