Property Assessment

Property assessment, an annual process, is regulated by the Alberta government. It provides an objective, open and accountable basis to ensure each property pays its fair share of the municipal and provincial education tax. Tax is needed from all properties to operate the Town's budgeted services and programs and pay the Province for education funding requirements.





Assessments are based upon market value effective July 1, 2023. The amount of tax a property pays is proportionate to its value.

On average, 2024 residential assessment values have increased by approximately 20%. Not all properties were assessed at this increase. If you have questions, see below for information on the inquiry process.
